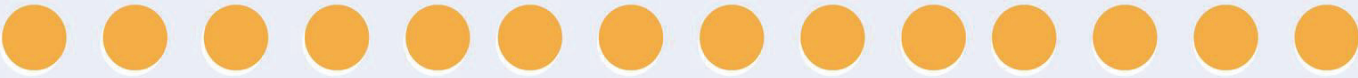

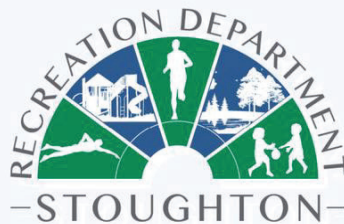

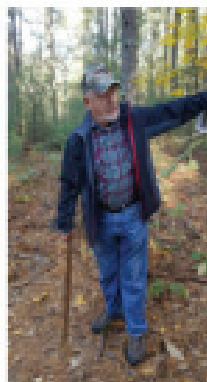

Approximate time 2 ¼ hours.

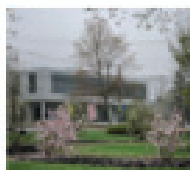
